## Distracted Driver/Pedestrian Project

D id you know that every year nearly 500 pedestrians ages 19 and under are killed and more than 16,000 a visit hospital emergency rooms with injures? This is due in part to the increased use of cell phones and other



mobile devices available to teen pedestrians, distracted walking is becoming an increasing concern in regard to safety.


In a attempt to address this important issue, Safe kids Worldwide is undertaking a national project to determine the prevalence of distracted walking and driver behavior in school zones across the county.

As part of the initiative we will evaluate the effectiveness of a public health message informing pedestrians crossing the street and drivers

in drop –off and pick –up locations in school zones on the dangers of distracted walking and driving.

Mountain Lakes High School and Briarcliff Middle School have agreed to participate in this study.

Sgt. Gil Benitez from the Mt. Lakes Police Department has been the liaison between the school and Northern NJ



Safe Kids /Safe Communities. High School Students have been participating in observation stage of the project by collecting data.

As of April 18, 2016 both schools have signs and street stencils that say "Heads Up, Phones Down".

We will share the results later this summer.

Water Saftey Tips at Home

#### Don't Leave Kids Alone in or Around Water

- Never leave your child unattended around water. We know it sounds strict, but there is no room for compromise on this one. Babies can drown in as little as one inch of water.
- Put the cell phone away, forget about all the other things

you have to do and give young children 100 percent of your attention when they are near or around water.

• When using inflatable or portable pools, remember to empty them immediately after use. Store them upside down and out of children's reach. These types of pools can pose a drowning risk

#### Close Lids and Doors

- Keep toilet lids closed and use toilet seat locks to prevent drowning.
- Keep doors to bathrooms and laundry rooms closed.

### Remove Water From Tubs and Buckets After Use

- Once bath time is over, immediately drain the tub.
- Empty all tubs, buckets,

containers and wading pools immediately after use. Store them upside down and out of children's reach.

#### Learn CPR

• Parents have a million things to do, but learning CPR should be on the top of the list. It will give you tremendous peace of mind – and the more peace of mind you have as a parent, the better.


# Hats off for Helmet Winners!
